

Does Your Child Need Immediate Attention?

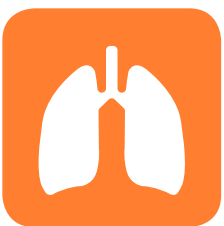
Follow these tips to help determine if the situation is an emergency.

Go to the nearest ER if:



Temperature is 101° or higher
for infants under 3 months

Temperature is 103° or higher
for babies 3 months and older

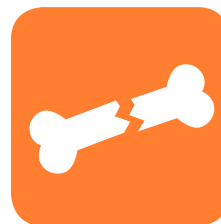


Having **trouble breathing**,
signs include:

- Nostrils moving outward when breathing in
- Visible ribs or collarbone when breathing in



Having a **seizure**



Broken bone;
open wound;
tingling feeling



Stiff neck with other
symptoms such as
fever, numbness
or dehydration



Changes in muscle tone
such as stiffness



Ingested a toxic chemical or
medication not prescribed.
